Amendments to Chapter 34A based on recommendations contained within the 911 PSAP Consolidation Study as requested by the General Assembly.

- Consolidation Plan
 - Combine wireline 911 network into wireless 911 network
 - Create shared service environment for PSAP call processing equipment
 - Plan shall include recurring and non-recurring costs for development, deployment, operation, and maintenance.

The technical reasons to have two separate networks have been eliminated. The wireless network runs with modern technology and provides better service. Creation of shared service environment for PSAP call processing would further leverage network to deliver a possible cost saving measure for the PSAP. Shared service would be elective for the PSAP. **Both measures seek to better leverage technology and remove costs at the local PSAP level.**

- Funding Changes – Goal is to spend 99% of annual collected revenue
 - Leaves PSAP pass through at 60%, pg 16 ln 30
 - Creates PSAP GIS grants, \$15,000/PSAP, pg 17 ln 35
 - LMR funding eliminated, pg 18 ln 24
 - Carryover Operating Surplus, SFY '18 \$7,000,000, pg 18 ln 31
 - Consolidation Grant of \$200,000 for physical consolidation only
 - Remainder passed to PSAP for "receipt and disposition"
 - Creates \$9,000,000 to support Consolidation Plan
- Technical Updates
 - Convert "E911" to "911"
 - Update definitions to reflect current and future environment
 - Adds Iowa Geographic Information Council member and EMA to 911 Communications Council
